The wonder and joy on the kids' face say it all. Enjoy glimpses from the program. More photos










A Shloka



Sathya Shivakumar recounts the tale of the unexpected blessing, at an unexpected time which resulted in the creation of the Himalayan School of Traditional Dance, weaving together a deep-seated desire to pass on a beloved art form and the preservation of an ancient tradition of transformation through dance.

Guru tattva (the Guru principle) leads mankind to experience the highest awareness by propelling people to go beyond the gross, all to the subtle levels to connect to the Supreme energetic principle. It is an eternal principle that takes myriad forms to lead those ready to take on a journey of self-nullification and unification.

This grand phenomenon takes over when least expected and leaves a long-lasting impression, burning all lower impressions on the way. From that moment on, things begin to change. Patterns start breaking down, and the person begins a journey of self-exploration, of understanding that what one seeks outside is already inside them.



Initially, the Guru watches over and protects the devotee like a tortoise guarding its offspring closely. The Guru then treats the devotee much like a cat that takes its offspring to the places it finds safest. Later on, just like an infant clinging to its mother, it becomes the responsibility of the disciple to hold on to the Guru. With further advancement, the disciple swims like a baby fish with its mother.

Mohanji is a living example of how the Guru Tattva, as explained in the Sripada Charitra, operates. Not only that it guides us spiritually, but also practically. We are encouraged not to run away from our sacred duty, but rather to face it, accept and fulfill it in our best capacity. Not to impress anyone, but to make sure there are no residual unfinished agendas, paving the way to ultimate liberation.


Behind the Scenes


Needless to say, Mohanji's grace is the guiding light from start to finish.
